Because when a girl sees another woman leading a digital rollout, managing a server migration, or standing in front of a room explaining a tech strategy with clarity and confidence, it changes what she believes is possible.

We are building more than systems at Access Bank, we are building pathways. Pathways that are safe from bias. Safe from doubt. And rich with encouragement.

Every click, every class, every conversation matters. We are planting seeds of confidence in girls who will one day transform Botswana's digital future. So let's stop imagining inclusion as a finish line. It should be the starting point.

When girls feel safe in digital space, when they feel truly seen, they do more than thrive. They lead.

So yes, WiFi and code are important. But confidence? That's the game changer.

And when we commit to creating spaces where girls feel safe, seen, and supported, we don't just change their lives, we change the future of tech in Botswana.

One girl. One safe space. One line of code at a time.
